Meet the Library Director: Michael Cummings





Database Spotlight

The Cochrane Library is a collection of six databases including the following:

Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews (CDSR)
Cochrane Central Register of Controlled Trials (CENTRAL)
Cochrane Methodology Register (CMR)
Database of Abstracts of Reviews of Effects (DARE)
Health Technology Assessment Database (HTA)
NHS Economic Evaluation Database (EED)

The library subscribes to full text only in the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews. (In the other Cochrane databases, link-outs to full text, such as in PubMed Central, may be available but are not guaranteed.) A systematic review summarizes the existing clinical research on a topic and provides a high-level of evidence on the effectiveness of healthcare interventions. Judgments may be made about the evidence and inform recommendations for healthcare. Nursing, hospice and health sciences students will find this resource very helpful when conducting a literature review.

In "Terror in the City of Champions" Mr. Stanton tells for the first time the riveting, intersecting tales of the frightening rise and fall of the Black Legion and the magnificent athletic ascension of Detroit. Mr. Stanton author of several nonfiction books, among them the critically acclaimed Tiger Stadium memoir "The Final Season" and the Quill Award finalist "Ty and The Babe." A journalist for more than thirty years, he co-founded The Voice Newspapers in suburban Detroit and served as editor for 16 years, winning numerous press awards, including a Knight-Wallace Fellowship at the University of Michigan.
